POSTAL INFORMATION.

Post Office, New York City.

September 1st, 1914.

First-Class Matter.—Letters, hand or typewritten matter, post cards, mail sealed against inspection.

Second-Class Matter.—Newspapers, periodicals and publications, so entered by publisher.

Third-Class Matter.—Proof accompanied by manuscript, pamphlets, etc., unsealed for inspection.

Fourth-Class Parcel Post.—Books, all mailable matter, including farm and factory products not embraced in number of the first, second and third classes. Limit of size 7 1/2 inches length and 6 1/2 inches width. Zones I and II, radius of approximately 150 miles, 50 lbs.; all other zones 20 lbs.

Domestic Rates, First-Class.—Letters, Sealed Matter.

Two cents per ounce or fraction thereof. At offices with no free delivery by carriers or delivery by rural free delivery carriers, one cent per ounce or fraction thereof. Local or drop letters at free delivery offices, two cents per ounce or fraction thereof.

Domestic Rates apply on letters to any part of the United States or its possessions, Alaska, Canada, Canal Zone, China (Shanghai City only), Cuba, Germany, Great Britain, Guam, Hawaiian Islands, Ireland, Mexico, Newfoundland, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, Republic of Panama, Tutuila (Samoa), and to mail addressed to officers and members of crew on U. S. War vessels.

A steamship landing mail at a German port takes matter prepaid at domestic rate, two cents per ounce. If prepaid at foreign rate, five cents an ounce, mail for Germany is landed at Plymouth, England, or Cherbourg, France, and thence by rail to destination, the quickest route.

Domestic Rates, First-Class—Postal Cards. One cent each. Double or reply cards, two cents.

Domestic rates apply to any part of the U. S., its possessions, to all of the above mentioned locations except Great Britain, Ireland, Newfoundland and Germany. To those countries and to all others in the Postal Union, the rate on postal cards is two cents each. Double or reply cards, four cents each.

First-Class—Articles Included. Among the articles included in first-class matter are the following: Letters, postal cards, hand or typewritten matter, letter press or carbon copies of same, and imitations or reproductions of same. Matter so sealed or wrapped as not to be easily examined, assessment notices printed with amount due written, blank books with written entries, checks, filled out, cancelled or otherwise, all signed forms, cards or letters printed with *written date not later than date of mailing*, or when sender will call, deliver books will occur or be acknowledged with have been received, cards printed for receipts, orders, etc., with written signature. Copy written or typed *without proof of sheets*. Envelope with written addresses other than those of sender or addressee. Folders of stiff paper the entire surface of which is unsealed or sealed with a gummed seal. Price printed containing written figures changing individual items. *Shorthand notes. Unsealed communications or letters.*

Second-Class Matter—Rates of Postage.

To Publishers.—One cent per pound or fraction thereof prepaid in currency.

To Others than Publishers or News Agents.—The rate is one cent for each four ounces or fraction thereof, on second-class newspapers, magazines or periodicals. Note that rate is one cent for each 4 ounces, not one cent for each paper contained in the same wrapper.

Second-Class Matter Includes the following:

Newspapers and Periodicals exclusively in print entered as second-class matter, issued at stated intervals, four times a year or more and mailed to subscribers or news agents. Periodicals, publications of benevolent and fraternal societies, and lodges with a thousand members. Publications of strictly professional, literary, historical and scientific societies, trade unions, etc., published four times a year or more. Publications for advertising or free circulation without legitimate list of subscribers from second-class matter and pay third-class rate. Publications sent to actual subscribers in the country where published at free unless mailed for delivery at a letter carrier office. When second-class matter so that postmaster may easily inspect same. "Sample Copy," or "Marked Copy," may be written on wrapper, typographical errors in text may be corrected, *no writing subjects matter to letter postage.*

Third-Class Matter—Rates of Postage.

One cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof. If two thousand or more identical pieces are mailed under special permit, postage may be paid in money. Postage on third-class matter must be fully prepaid and admit of easy inspection. New postage must be prepaid for forwarding to a new address or returning to sender. The limit of weight is four pounds.

Third-Class—Articles included. Among articles subject to third-class rate are: Advertisements on blotting paper, almanacs, assessment notices, wholly in print. Bills—legal, forms of insurance applications, etc., mainly in print. Imitations, etc., of or typewriting by multigraph, mimeograph, etc. *Calendar cards and designs. Calendar cards, designs, Easter, Birthday, Holiday Cards and Valentines. Catalogues and Price Lists. Grain (seed for planting). Imitations. Reproductions, etc., of or typewriting by multigraph, mimeograph, etc. Identical copies or forms are mailed at P. O. window. Lithographs, maps, memoranda, receipt, check books, etc., mainly in print. Music books and sheet music. Photos on paper. Proof sheets with or without copy.*

Special Delivery.—Rate ten cents for each letter, parcel or package in addition to the regular postage. This applies to first, second, third and fourth class—Parcel Post matter. For this service use ten cent special delivery stamp or six to ten cents in ordinary postage and use the words, "Special Delivery," on the wrapper.

Registration.—All postal matter except fourth-class Parcel Post, may be registered for ten cents, each package in addition to regular rates of postage to be fully prepaid in stamps. Envelope or parcel must bear name and address of sender. Receipt returned if requested. An identity not to exceed \$50 for any one registered piece or the actual value of the piece if less than \$50 shall be paid for loss of first-class registered matter mailed at or addressed to a United States Post Office.

Unmailable Matter.—Certain articles, drugs, liquors, compositions, writings, books, poisonous insects, explosives, germs, live animals, odoriferous substances, libelous or defamatory writings, etc., are prohibited by law from transportation in the mails.

Collect On Delivery Service—Domestic Parcel Post. The sender of a mailable parcel fully prepaid provided C. O. D. amount does not exceed \$100.00. Such parcel is insured against loss without additional charge at actual value or not to exceed \$50.00. A special C. O. D. tag must be used. Addressee not permitted to examine contents of parcel without paying charges.

Domestic Money Orders.—Payable in the United States and its possessions comprising the Canal Zone, Republic of Panama, Hawaii and Porto Rico, Guam, the Philippines and Tutuila (Samoa); also for orders payable in Brazil, Guiana, British Honduras, Canada, Cuba, Newfoundland, the United States Parcel Post at Shanghai (China), the Bahamas Islands, Virgin Islands, Westward Islands, Jamaica, Bermuda and Mexico, Antigua, Barbados, Dominica, Granada, Martinique, Montserrat, Nevis, St. Vincent, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, Trinidad, Tobago.

For orders from \$0.10 to \$2.50, 3 cents; from \$2.51 to \$5.00, 5 cents; from \$5.01 to \$10.00, 8 cents; from \$10.01 to \$20.00, 12 cents; from \$20.01 to \$50.00, 15 cents; from \$50.01 to \$100.00, 18 cents; from \$100.01 to \$500.00, 20 cents; from \$500.01 to \$750.00, 25 cents; from \$750.01 to \$1000.00, 30 cents.

POSTAL INFORMATION—(Continued).

Foreign Postage Rates and Conditions.—On all articles not fully prepaid, double the deficiency postage will be collected on delivery.

Letters.—1st ounce or less, 5 cents; each additional ounce or fraction, 3 cents.

Postal Cards, 2 cents, double or reply cards 4 cents.

Newspapers and printed matter, limit 4 pounds 6 ounces; 1 cent for 10 ounces.

Merchandise.—Limit 4 pounds 6 ounces; 5 cents 10 ounces or less, 1 cent each additional 2 ounces.

of Merchandise.—Limit, 12 ounces; 2 cents 4 ounces or less, 1 cent each additional 2 ounces or fraction.

Postage Fee.—For letters and other articles, 10 cents.

International Reply Coupons.—May be purchased at 6 cents each and will be exchanged for postage stamps of any country equivalent in value to five cents.

Parcel Post Rate.—12 cents per pound or fraction thereof. Cannot be insured, but may be registered. Weight (except Mexico), 11 pounds. Limit of size, apply to Postmaster.

Foreign Money Orders.—Payable in any country except those mentioned under "Domestic Money Order" cities at following rates: \$0.01 to \$10.00, 10 cents; amounts to \$20.00, 20 cents; to \$30.00, 30 cents; to \$40.00, 40 cents; to \$50.00, 50 cents, etc. \$100.00 limit for one order, \$1.00.

Domestic Parcel Post—Fourth Class. Mail matter embraces all matter not included in first, second and third class. See opposite *Fourth-Class—Parcel Post*, for limit of weight and size. Parcels must bear name and address of sender prepaid by the word "From." Must not be sealed or closed against inspection. Must not contain writing.

Insurance.—A Domestic Parcel may be insured against loss equivalent to its actual value not to exceed \$25.00 on payment of a fee of 5 cents, and on its actual value of \$25.00 not to exceed \$50.00 on payment of fee of 10 cents.
